



## Endowed Funds

Endowed funds help to ensure that the very best pre-hospital emergency medical care will always be available, today as well as in the future, because only the interest income from the funds is used. The endowment principal remains intact forever, offering a donor the satisfaction of knowing that his or her gift will continue working for generations to come.

An endowed fund may be named after yourself or your family, your parents, or other individuals you wish to honor. Also, endowed funds may be restricted for a specific purpose or program, such as research, paramedic training or emergency medical equipment.

Recognition for endowed funds is offered on the Foundation's Donor Recognition Wall, in Foundation publications and in award letters for paramedic training scholarships, research grants or emergency medical equipment grants.

### **Named endowed funds may be established at the following gift levels:**

\$250,000	Research Endowed Fund
\$150,000	Paramedic Training Endowed Fund
\$50,000	General Endowed Fund (provides unrestricted support where ever the need is greatest)
\$50,000	Emergency Medical Equipment Endowed Fund
