You probably never think about the quality of training paramedics receive or how to improve your chances of survival before you even reach the hospital when faced with a life-threatening medical emergency. But, the Medic One Foundation does—every day.

**Thanks to you and your support of the Medic One Foundation, we are saving more lives.**

In 2016, contributions to the Medic One Foundation made it possible to:

- Train and certify twenty-three new paramedics who are now in the field saving lives in Arlington, Bellevue, Camano Island, Everett, Lynnwood, Marysville, Redmond, Seattle, Shoreline, South King County, and Bainbridge Island.
- Fund 30 hours of continuing medical education for more than 280 paramedics in the Puget Sound area, as well as first responders throughout Washington, Alaska, Montana, and Idaho via live video feed of continuing education classes.
- Launch PulsePoint, a mobile application now available in Seattle, that will alert CPR-trained citizens to a nearby sudden cardiac arrest in order to get CPR started in the critical lifesaving minutes before first responders arrive.
- Research the use of a non-imaging ultrasound Doppler probe to quickly and accurately measure blood flow entering the brain during and after treatment of cardiac arrest.
- Expand our hands-only CPR and AED training program for businesses, civic and neighborhood groups, and community events.
- Provide much-needed equipment, including defibrillators and training manikins, to the cities of Arlington, Bainbridge Island, Gold Bar, Kent, and Stanwood.
